Applicant must complete the GCA Scholarship Application and submit the following documents:

- A one or two-page (typed) autobiographical essay which includes career objective, personal goals, educational plans, and any important information addressing why you should be considered.
- Resume with list of awards and achievements.
- Two (2) letters of recommendation on letterhead from a teacher, counselor, community leader, coach, mentor, advisor, minister, or employer.
- Copy of your most recent high school transcript and report card.
- Copy of final transcript upon graduation.

After all requirements are met, the applicant will be interviewed by the GCA Scholarship Committee.

4. Volunteer hours served **ONLY** in the Grandmont Community will be accepted.
5. Volunteer hours served outside of the Grandmont Community, but for the benefit of the Grandmont Community, must be approved by the Scholarship Committee.

Suggested examples of volunteer opportunities:

- Pass out the Grandmonitor and/or submit articles
- Volunteer as a street or block captain or co-captain
- Assist with the GCA Annual Business Meeting in April
- Volunteer at the Reading Ramsay Park
- Volunteer at the Backpack Giveaway
- Volunteer at the Hat & Glove Drive
- Help with the Ramsay Park cleanup
- Volunteer as a photographer during Grandmont events
- Volunteer at Chaney Library or Redford Library
- Volunteer during any GCA activity not previously mentioned
- Assist an elderly neighbor with yardwork or other outside help
