




GRANDMONT COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION HAT & GLOVE DRIVE!

D1 Is Changing its Boundaries based on the latest census numbers per city requirements. We want Grandmont to be located in D1 within these new redistricting areas. Our Grandmont Community has built many friendships and working relationships with D1 Department of Neighborhoods, city officials and inspectors, as well as with our Grandmont-Rosedale communities just West of Southfield, and other neighborhoods working together to better our quality of life in District 1. It doesn't make sense to group us in another district after all the work and progress already done and planned future projects.



While Grandmont seems included in the D1 new projections, we can't count out last minute changes or exclusions. Be actively engaged in this process by making your voice heard. Call Pro-Tem Councilman Tate's office today (and other Council members) to let them know we want and need to stay together within the D1 boundaries!

ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERNS:

Please keep vehicles parked off the grass! This is becoming an unnecessary nuisance in many of our communities, including Grandmont, for no good reason. Cars leach hazardous fluids that can contaminate our groundwater, property values are lowered, and if left for long periods of time, rodents, etc., build homes and nest in these vehicles. If this is your argument, a few steps saved are not worth getting a ticket for this illegal action.

Commercial Vehicles: Our residential area is not zoned to park commercial vehicles, flatbed tow trucks, or box trucks on private property or overnight on neighborhood streets.



Please don't be that neighbor that doesn't care about communities having high expectations. Take the extra steps to keep Grandmont's focus on family home values and attractive surroundings.

HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS FROM THE 8TH PRECINCT NPO'S



SHOPPING SAFETY TIPS

- 1. Shop during daylight hours whenever possible.
- 2. Let someone know your shopping plan and when you are returning.
- 3. Try not to shop alone.
- 4. Carry your purse close to your shoulder; carry your wallet in your front pocket.
- 5. Avoid wearing expensive jewelry and carrying large amounts of cash.
- 6. Avoid overloading yourself with packages. This helps you keep clear visibility and avoid mishaps.

PARKING SAFETY

- 1. If you must shop at night, park in well-lit areas.
- 2. Lock your car.
- 3. Do not leave valuables in your car in plain view.
- 4. Know where you parked.
- 5. Have your key or key fob in your hand when walking to your vehicle.
- 6. Look around your vehicle before approaching it.
- 7. If equipped, ensure your phone is charged and keep a charging cable in the car.
- 8. Please refrain from talking on the phone while walking in the parking lot to reduce distractions.
- 9. Ask mall or store security for an escort to your vehicle, if available.

SHOPPING WITH CHILDREN

- 1. If you are shopping with children, make a plan in case you are separated from each other.
- 2. Make sure your child has a contact number for you. If the children are too small to remember the contact number, pin a copy of the number (or write it) on the inside of their jackets.
- 3. Never leave children in the car alone.
- 4. Teach children to know they can ask mall personnel or store security employees if they need help.


Did you know that you have a chance to elect board members to the Grandmont Community Association every year at our annual meeting? Did you know we are looking for folks to get involved?


