All of the 16 residents received their assessment from a Rippling Hope Staff. The assessments confirm the items selected on homeowners application, what is required in terms of supplies and materials so home repair can be planned accordingly.

Each association or block club was asked to donate a dinner for the volunteers. I will ask each resident to donate a food item for the dinner. Our date for the dinner is Monday, June 13th. I haven't received the date for Grandmont's free home repair service. When I receive the date, I will notify the 16 residents.

Rippling Hope has paint, dog food, cat food and cat litter available. All are free! This program is available to all Grandmont Community Association Residents every month, all year! Make sure to tell the distributor that you are a GCA Resident. Distribution is the first Tuesday of each month from Noon-2:00pm. The second day is the first Saturday of each month from 10:00am-Noon.
