COFFEE WITH A COP



On Wednesday, June 14, 2023, I attended the in-person (& TEAM) Coffee with a Cop meeting at the 8th Precinct (west of the Meijer store on Grand River).

What I learned was more than I anticipated and can remember. Much of the conversation revolved around guns. Revolvers, long guns, open carry and concealed weapons were all discussed, among other gun related topics. The consensus was that too few people know what's legal and not allowed as well as the rules of the road, so to speak.

NPO Sgt. Crystal Johns (313-549-7698) and Commander Newson (313-236-7615) are interested to know if a "Community Meeting" should be scheduled (perhaps at a Neighborhood Safety Meeting) to educate and inform us of the regulations and what is and is not legal and acceptable behaviors relating to guns and gun safety.

If this is something you would like as a topic of conversation, please let us know (call or email a board member) and/or call one of the above numbers. For instance, I learned that you can carry a weapon in plain sight as "open carry" in Michigan, but as soon as you enter a vehicle with that "open carry" weapon, that weapon is now considered "concealed" and the rules change for what is now legal. You need to know the law or risk being stopped by police, ticketed, or becoming a danger to the community.

Lt. Demps (Special Operations) also shared some interesting information, and Wayne County Sheriff's Department was represented by Grandmont's Muhsin Muhammed for a good representation and coordinated law enforcement efforts to keep us safer in our neighborhoods. Corporal Dovas and Corporal Catlin reported on the Grand River Avenue traffic detail (speeding, ATVs, parking, commercial truck illegal parking, street food vending, etc.) If you need to reach them, you can call the 8th Precinct Desk at 313-596-5801 and leave a message.

ACCIDENTS: One subject that all police agreed upon is that if you are involved in an accident and a tow truck shows up that you have not called, DO NOT have your car towed by them. Wait for a police tow, or call your own tow truck. Numerous legal (but not ethical) instances of people's vehicle's being "held hostage" until tacked on or changed costs are paid in order to retrieve your vehicle were noted. It's best to wait for the police, and let them call a tow from one of the seven police contracted companies, or call your own tow. Some unscrupulous towing companies listen to the police scanners, show up, say they were called by the police, and make promises, take advantage of your stress, and then charge additional fees which you could be stuck paying in addition to the price you were initially quoted. The police can't help you because a police tow wouldn't have been called until the police arrived at the scene and assessed the situation.

TIDBITS!

ARE YOU OVER 65? - ARE YOU RECEIVING A SENIOR CITIZEN CREDIT ON YOUR DTE ELECTRIC BILL?

Check your DTE bill now, under the bold print "Delivery Charges" section, you should see a <u>-4.25 cent credit</u> listed as "Senior Citizen Credit" every month (\$51.00/year) on your DTE Bill. If you don't see this, you're not receiving this discount on your bill if you are over 65. This is NOT the Senior Program, but a separate credit you must ask for. There are no qualifications except age and perhaps property ownership. Call DTE at 800-477-4747 (Accounting or Billing - or just press 0 to get a customer representative.)

SPEAKING OF DTE - DO YOU HAVE LAWN CONCERNS ABOUT THE GRASS PLANTED BY DTE?

Last year DTE was in our neighborhood as part of the <u>Gas Renewal Program</u> and re-seeded the berm area of many of our lawns (between the sidewalk & the street). Many neighbors are frustrated with the taller grass and weeds that were not there before DTE planted this new grass. While this might be an issue with the fill dirt used, the resulting grass now has many types of invasive weeds that are difficult to cut and are contributing to an appearance of an unmaintained community.

<u>313-270-9240</u> is the number to call to file a complaint. This RES-TORATION TEAM should be able to make this right. If you are experiencing problems with the grass that was planted on the berm area by DTE contractors, <u>call 313-270-9240 Monday-Friday (8am-4pm)</u> to report your complaint.

Ultimately by taking these steps we rebuild and strengthen the family structure through improved communications.

HOST FAMILIES NEEDED FOR 2023 PROGRAM

Would you like to develop an international friendship and learn more about another culture – without even traveling? If so, then consider hosting a Japanese teenager or adult this summer.

Families are needed to host a student or a chaperone from Toyota City, Japan as part of the Detroit Sister Cities Program. Preference is given to Detroit families. However, families outside Detroit are considered for hosting. The group of ten individuals – eight students and two chaperones – will visit Detroit to learn more about the American culture and stay for two weeks. **Tentative** dates are early August - mid August 2023.

During the group's visit, there are various activities, including trips to the Detroit Institute of Arts, Museum of African American History, Belle Isle, Niagara Falls and The Henry Ford. The group activities are scheduled on the weekdays, leaving the weekends and evenings open for activities with host families.

In addition, high school students will be selected to visit Japan in 2024. The Detroit-Toyota Sister Cities Program began in 1960, and the student exchange began in 1965.

GCA RADIO PATROL



Interested in joining the GCA Radio Patrol? The Citizens Radio Patrol Program of Detroit is one of the City's best safety success stories. Established by a Detroit City Council Resolution in 1967, the Radio Patrol Program has been an essential part of the strength and safety of Detroit's neighborhoods and individual patrols have been established in communities throughout Detroit.

The patrols were established to help serve as extended "eyes and ears" for the Detroit Police Department. Each of the patrols consists of a number of volunteers who commit a small portion of their time each month to serve as a base operator, a driver or an observer.

The volunteers are trained to look for specific signs when on patrol. They report any suspicious activity to the police and NEVER put themselves in danger or confront suspicious individuals.

- Drivers are reimbursed for their mileage totals for each month
- Partner with the DPD to deter crime
- A Safer Neighborhood with EXTRA "Eyes and Ears"

- Improve your Quality of Life




