April Meeting Recap!



The plans for the Annual Meeting and the Youth and Education Committee's Youth Expo are well underway! The events are planned to occur simultaneously on April 29 from 1-4 pm. The Youth and Education Expo will have vendors, a book swap for children, middle grade, and young adult book titles and they will also begin to collect school supplies for their annual backpack and supply drive in August. The Annual Business Meeting will have a meal, updates from our committees, and board and board elections.

We also had a lively discussion surrounding membership and street and block captains. The membership committee is starting a phone drive for membership and reminding residents of the Annual Meeting. They will continue the drive going door to door in May or June. The committee is working in conjunction with the Street and Block Captain committee to continue to engage and increase membership. We also had a discussion around a QR code to pay for dues and either shirts, cards with lanyards to help to advertise and share information while on dues drives.

If you are looking for opportunities to learn more about gardening or get into beautification in the community, there will be many opportunities to do so in the coming months! The Annual Ramsay Park Clean-up will happen on April 22. Election Results

The five, newly elected GCA Board members are Samantha Bonaparte, Jenise Collins, Harrison Duke, III, Susan Hood and Krystal Thurmond. They will serve as board members until April 2025. Residents voted to amend the Grandmont By-Laws to include the language:

"In the event of a national emergency or other government ordered shutdown affecting the City of Detroit and/or the Grandmont Community, the GCA board shall be empowered to determine the appropriate actions and procedures to continue the functioning of the Grandmont Community Association. Such board action shall be taken to ensure the safety of GCA residents and the continuity and continuation of the Grandmont Community Association

Emergency actions taken in accordance with this provision may remain in effect for no longer than 120 days. However, after 120 days these actions may be continued if the emergency or shutdown remains in effect. Such renewals of the emergency actions and procedures may be approved by the GCA board until such time as the national emergency or other government ordered shutdown has been resolved:

- 1. Establish a revised schedule and/or structure for the continuation of meetings and activities of the GCA.
- 2. Communication of any changes from the normal board schedule or procedures must be immediately communicated to the GCA membership. Once the GCA board has agreed upon a revised schedule, structure, and/or procedures for such meetings, these changes will be communicated to the GCA members as soon as possible. Communication to the members of said changes shall be made in the next issue of the Grandmonitor newsletter as well as other electronic, written, or verbal forms of communication.
- 3. If necessary, the Board may reschedule the annual meeting and board member elections. If this action is deemed to be necessary due to the emergency/shutdown, board member terms may be extended until the end of the declared emergency/shutdown. Within 30 days of the declared end to the emergency/shutdown, the board will announce and communicate the revised date of the annual meeting and election of board members.

This GCA Bylaws amendment is promulgated for the safety, security, and the benefit of all Grandmont residents and GCA members."

What I learned at "Coffee with a Cop"

On Wednesday, April 12, 2023, I attended the 8th Precinct's Coffee with a Cop meeting. The Wayne County Sheriff's department, Pro-Tem Councilman Tate's office, and various neighborhoods were represented at the April 12 meeting. Commander Newson updated us on summer programs. It was noted that the **Park Police** will be changed from a special City Wide Unit to each Precinct having three dedicated officers patrol Precinct Parks from 6pm-2am. Details are still being finalized and you can call 911 to report a park problem at Ramsay Park. The number given to call is 313-596-5801 (8th Precinct Desk - ask for the Park Detail).

There will also be a "Track Pack" Traffic & Parking Enforcement unit focusing on Grand River and our neighborhoods, as well as a "River Beat Unit" patrolling our area. For more information please email Commander Newson (Newsonv152@detroitmi.gov)

Commercial Truck Parking, ATVs, Mini Bikes, Lawn Parking, Drag Racing, etc. were addressed. The address of where the ATVs come from is needed to insure all parties are made aware of the law and penalties for violations. It should be noted that "Street Basketball" is also not legal on residential streets. (Parents: For safety reasons, please do not allow your children to play in the street!)

Police Appreciation is scheduled for the second week in May. An open house is tentatively scheduled for May 15th for the communities served by the 8th Precinct. Food donations given by the community can be made on May 19th. Police Appreciation Week is a special time to be thankful for and acknowledge all that is accomplished by police officers and staff for our benefit. We are fortunate to have many opportunities to talk to our officers. Coffee with a Cop is one way, as well as the monthly (last Monday of the month at 6:30 at the Precinct) Community-Police Relations Meeting). Officers often attend our Safety Meetings, Community Meetings, and more!). This is a good time to say THANK YOU.

Oh, and as an added incentive, the coffee was good and hot, great donuts, and fruit, cheese & crackers were enjoyed by everyone!

DID YOU KNOW?

Lids are required on all garbage containers.

Call Waste Management (844-233-8764) to request a new can if the lid can't be replaced. This is especially important if you share a driveway with your neighbor. You may not realize winds carry smells from unclean or unemptied containers. Containers without lids or with holes attract rodents and raccoons and create extra litter. Also remember that open garbage containers with protruding poles or long objects will not be collected, as these items can damage the truck mechanisms.

The Improve Detroit App is easy to use or you can always call Environmental Affairs at 313-876-0974 to report continuous neighborhood problems. The call is anonymous but you need to have the correct address of the problem house. Note that often community letters are sent first or our Environmental Committee meets with the neighbor, before contacting the city.

Other Summer Concerns:

In the coming months, the Grandmont Community encourages consideration and civility when it comes to family gatherings, graduations, etc. Noise travels and late night parties, loud music, and boisterous guests sometimes invites uninvited trouble. The noise level should be limited in consideration of your neighbor's job schedules, sleep and safety. Please be a considerate good neighbor.

GOOD ADVICE? Only Time Will Tell...

If it's "More blessed to give than to receive" here's some good advice we're giving as a Community. And let the blessings begin! These blessings, of course, will come in the form of cleaner, less littered streets, better views for everyone, better life-lessons for your children, and good neighbor community living in Grandmont (and less opportunity for neighbors being ticketed by the city for lack of ordinance compliance). Of course, we need YOU to do the right thing and support this good advice for us to receive these blessings. Will you help us?

Good Advice - Don't do this: Many neighbor complaints revolve around garbage containers and/or bulk items being improperly put out, or left at the curb after our scheduled Friday pickup.

Your neighbors don't want to (and shouldn't have to) look at your garbage container or bulk items on the street or in front of your home any longer than necessary. Ordinance Section 22-2-45 sets the time limit for containers to remain at the curb: Placed not earlier than 6pm the day before, and removed not later than 9pm on the collection day, unless there are legitimate reasons. Containers need to be kept at the rear of the house. Garbage should always be bagged before throwing it in the container.

Fines start at \$200. There's usually a grace period for the first complaint, but if this becomes a regular bad habit, you will be ticketed. There should be no reason your container is not off the street/berm and put back by Saturday at the latest. A trusted neighbor should be willing to help out if you are unable or away. The city will help if you are handicapped and you make prior arrangements with Waste Management.

Your dog wants to protect you and your home. However, **thousands** of letter carriers get bitten by dogs every year.

Question: Can a mailman refuse to deliver mail because of an unrestrained dog?

Answer: YES!



If the carrier deems a residence unsafe because of an unrestrained dog, mail delivery service can be interrupted. When service is interrupted at an address or in a neighborhood, all parties involved will have to pick up mail at their local Post Office. This information was confirmed by the Station Manager at the Strathmoor Post Office located at 13426 Schafer, Detroit, Michigan.

So "Good Neighbors" to avoid these situations, please be mindful of keeping your dog on a leash or inside your home behind locked doors or inside a secured fence.

Continue to be "Good Neighbors" and "Good and Responsible Dog owners".



Parents and/or students the 2023 Grandmont Scholarship Application Process is officially underway. To be considered for one of the scholarships the Grandmont Community Association Scholarship Committee has allotted for 2023, please carefully, review the instructions below. As stated earlier, our vision is to enhance the education of our youth by awarding scholarships. To continue this effort, parents, we need your support in assisting your graduating senior in meeting the **June 30th** deadline.

Your role in this process as a parent is to:

- ✓ Support and encourage your child to apply for the scholarship;
- ✓ Make certain your child is eligible by assisting them with completing all requirements;
- ✓ Serve as a good proofreader for their essay;
- ✓ Check to make sure that all documents are copied and submitted by **June 30**th.

DIRECTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE 2023 GRAND-MONT SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION PROCESS:

- ♦ A one or two page (typed) autobiographical essay which includes career objective, personal goals, educational plans and any important information concerning why you should be considered;
- ♦ List of awards and achievements;
- Two (2) letters of recommendation on letterhead from a teacher, counselor, community leader, coach, mentor, advisor, minister, or employer;
- Copy of high school transcript;
- ♦ Copy of report card

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: All applicants must:

- Be active in the Grandmont Community. Parents must be active as well.
- ♦ Have paid dues to the Grandmont Community Association for the past three consecutive years. However, the previous dues payments are waived for new residents.
- ♦ Have a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.0 or better.
- Be accepted at a post-secondary institution. Verification will be requested.
- Be interviewed by the GCA Scholarship Committee.

DO YOU HAVE A DEAD TREE ON PRIVATE PROPERTY or trees on private property that need trimming?

GOOD NEWS FROM THE CITY! Funds have been allocated in every district to remove or trim dangerous trees from private property **at no cost to the homeowner**. Details and qualifications are still being discussed by the City and General Services Department (GSD). If you have a dead or dangerous tree on your property please call the Environmental Committee - Harrison (837-4913) or Diane (836-3736) with your address and phone number so we can send this information from Grandmont to the City as soon as this program begins.
