#### VACANT PROPERTY TASK FORCE

If you are 65 or older, regardless of income, applying for the Senior Citizen Solid Waste Discount may save you \$125 on your Detroit Summer tax bill. The City of Detroit provides a discount to homeowners who are at least 65 years old and have a Principle Residence Exemption (PRE) on file. As of June 3, 2024, the Solid Waste Fee is \$250.00. Qualifying Seniors will receive a discount of \$125.00 on their Summer tax bill. If you continue to own and occupy the home, you do not need to reapply each year.

NOTE: Filing of this form is voluntary. Discount will not be processed unless the form has been filed. The Treasurer's Office may require additional documentation to verify your claim. If you need a form, please feel free to call me at (313) 836-3736.

The May dates for bulk, yard waste, and recycle pickup is May 10th and May 24th. As an FYI, due to the start of the new City contract with Waste Management, weekly pickup for everything will start Friday, June 7th.
