In the week before the Annual Meeting, the Grandmont Board met to discuss monthly business.

Grandmont's new Garden Club Chair is Lorena Rashid, who is a longtime member of the committee. Leading into the Annual meeting, the membership numbers for 2024 are at about 110 households. Our goal for 2024 is at least 300 memberships! Some discussion was had around the treasury and looking into having a savings account with better interest rates and other ways to get revenue or fundraise outside of membership dues. The Scholarship Committee is also seeking another grant for scholarship funds as well as working on refining the application. 

VACANT PROPERTY TASK FORCE

If you are 65 or older, regardless of income, applying for the Senior Citizen Solid Waste Discount may save you \$125 on your Detroit Summer tax bill. The City of Detroit provides a discount to homeowners who are at least 65 years old and have a Principle Residence Exemption (PRE) on file. As of June 3, 2024, the Solid Waste Fee is \$250.00. Qualifying Seniors will receive a discount of \$125.00 on their Summer tax bill. If you continue to own and occupy the home, you do not need to reapply each year.

INSTRUCTIONS:

File the Senior Citizen Application for Solid Waste Discount with the City of Detroit Treasurer's Office between July 1st and September 15th.


